






Colby High School Marching Band


The High School American Field Service Chapter worked closely with the adult chapter to earn money to finance the 1970-71 student's trip to the United States.






Hocus Pocus You're in Focus





Speaking skills, poise and confidence, necessary to aid a person throughout his life, are gained through participation in the forensic contest.







After a loss to Thorp, the Hornets defeated a champion Greenwood team 3-0 as the inspired Colby eleven held the vanquished Indians to three first downs. The game was won in the third quarter as a sophomore Dave Becherer kicked a 23 yard field goal to provide the margin. Colby then defeated Neillsville which set the stage for the game against Owen-Withee, the pre-season favorite to win the conference. A win would give Colby a co-championship. After leading 7-6 at the half, a second half error and a missed assignment cost the Hornets a championship. An excellent recovery was shown by a predominately underclass team. The future looks bright for the Hornets in football.

Tom Peissig led the team in rushing. He was also chosen all-conference on both offense and defense. Others selected on the all-conference team were offensive guard Norn Miller and tackle Gary Sterzinger. Those making all-conference honorable mention include: Wayne Reineking, Butch Firnstahl, Doug Ayer, Jerry Eggebrecht, and Dave Becherer.

CHS Gridders Win MVP Awards




