In their first conference game, the Hornets proved that the Neillsville team was no real challenge to them. The only loss of the season came against a fighting Greenwood team in our homecoming game. The Hornets, after a long drive,
scored first, only to have the Indians run the kick-off back. After two quarters of stalemating, the Indians scored one more touchdown. The Hornets started another drive, but it was nullified by a fumble on the one-half yard line. The game had no real victor until the final whistle sounded. In a great blockbuster the Hornets came back in pouring rain to trounce Loyal. The game Colby had to win was that against Thorp. When the game ended, the Hornets were back in the running once more. In order not to give their winning style away, the Big Green used new offensive and defensive strategy in their match against the Owen-Withee Blackhawks. At the end of the game, Colby was in the conference playoffs.

In the playoffs, the Hornets dominated the western division Gilman team. At the game's end the Hornets wound up in a tie for the division championship and second place in the Cloverbelt conference. Colby had a victorious $9-1$ season, and had scored a whomping 259 points to their opponents' 34 .
