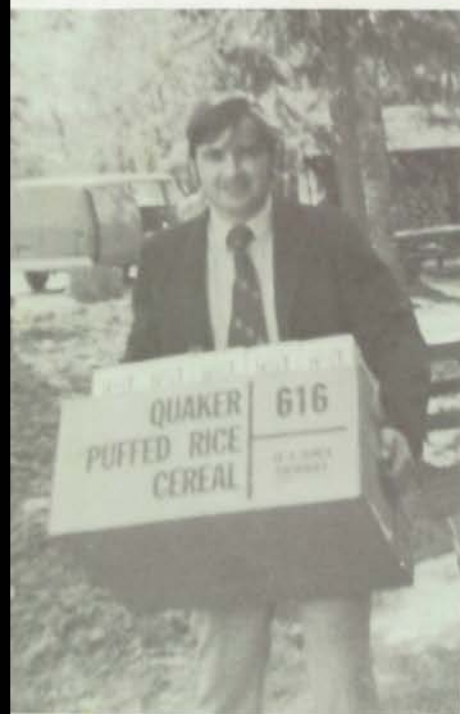

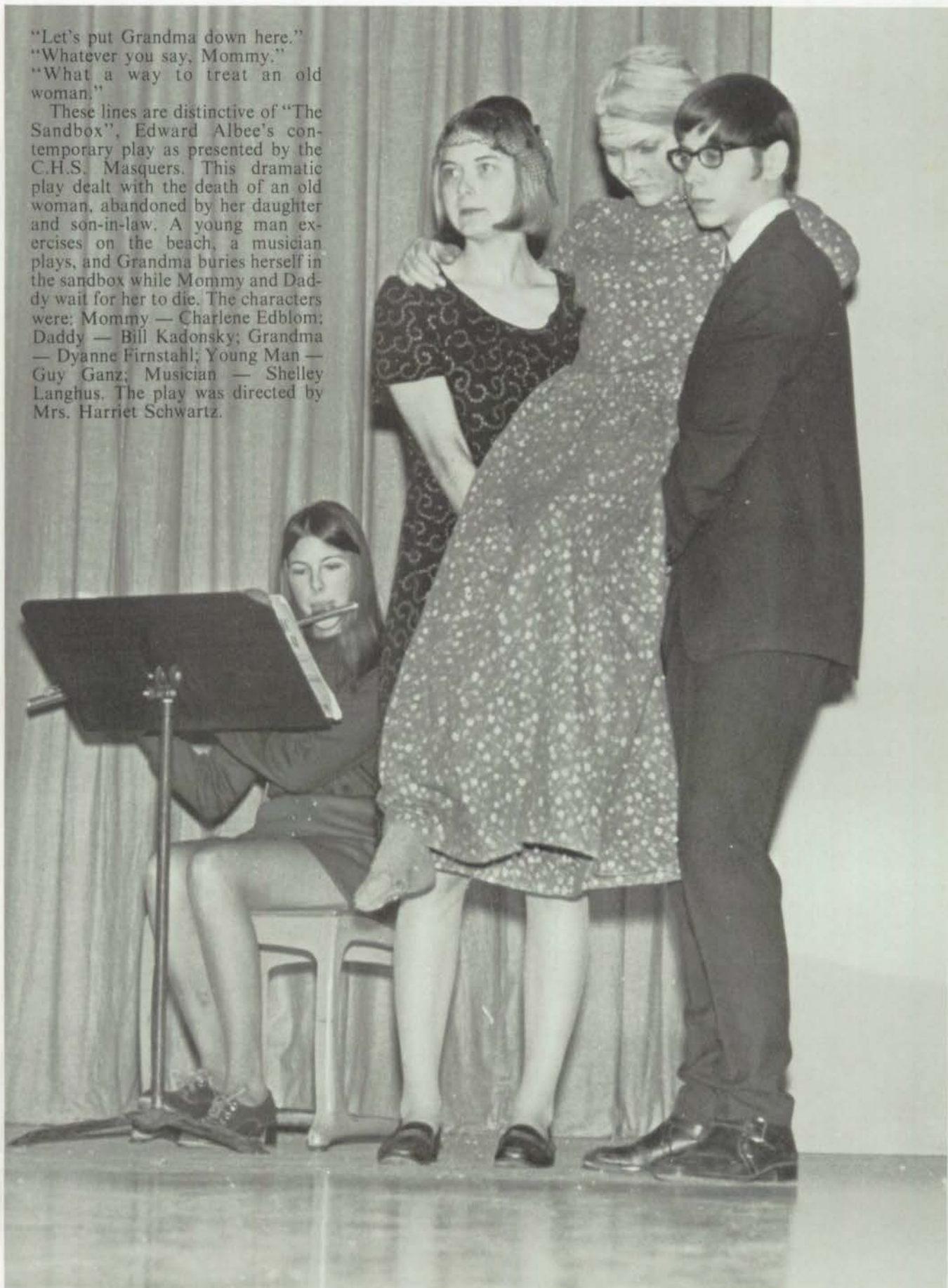

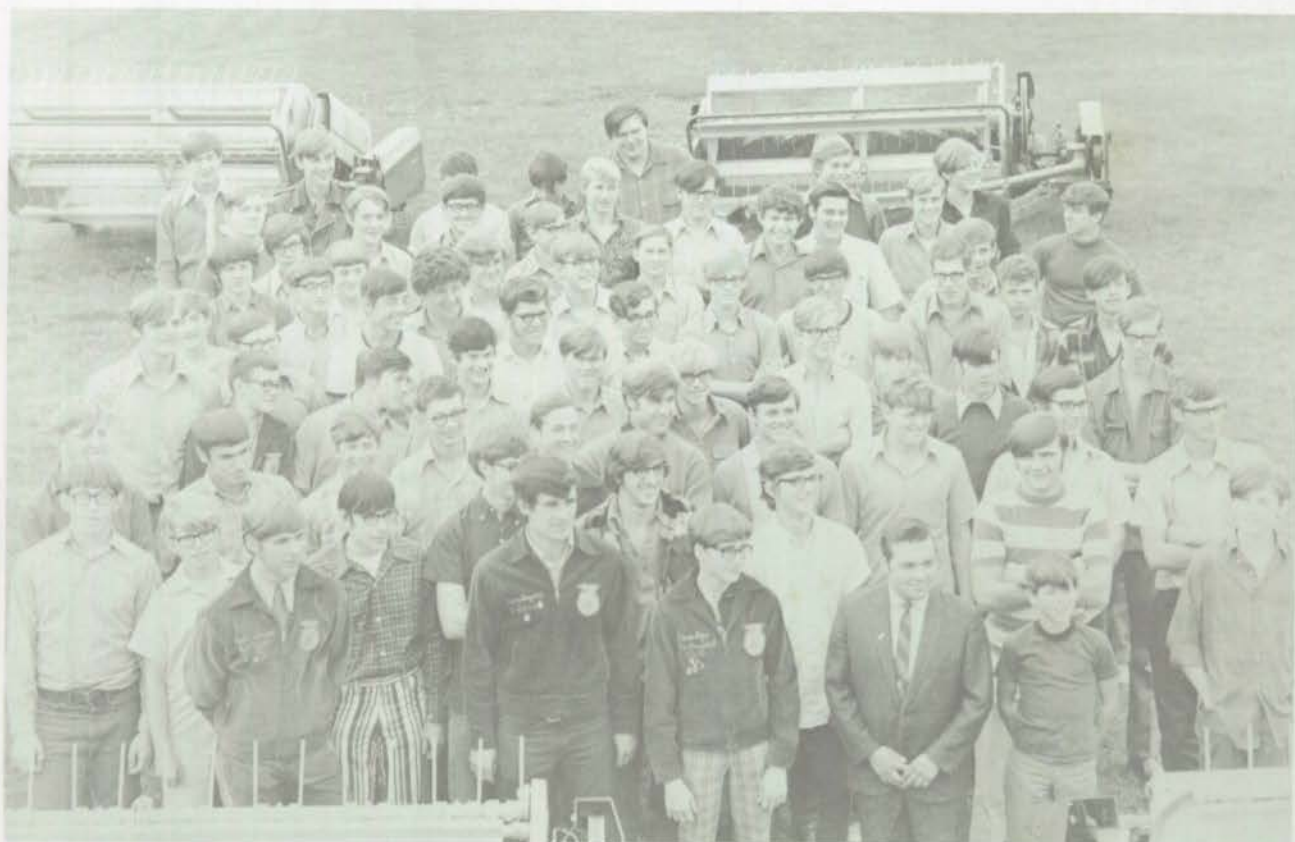
Council: Student's Voice

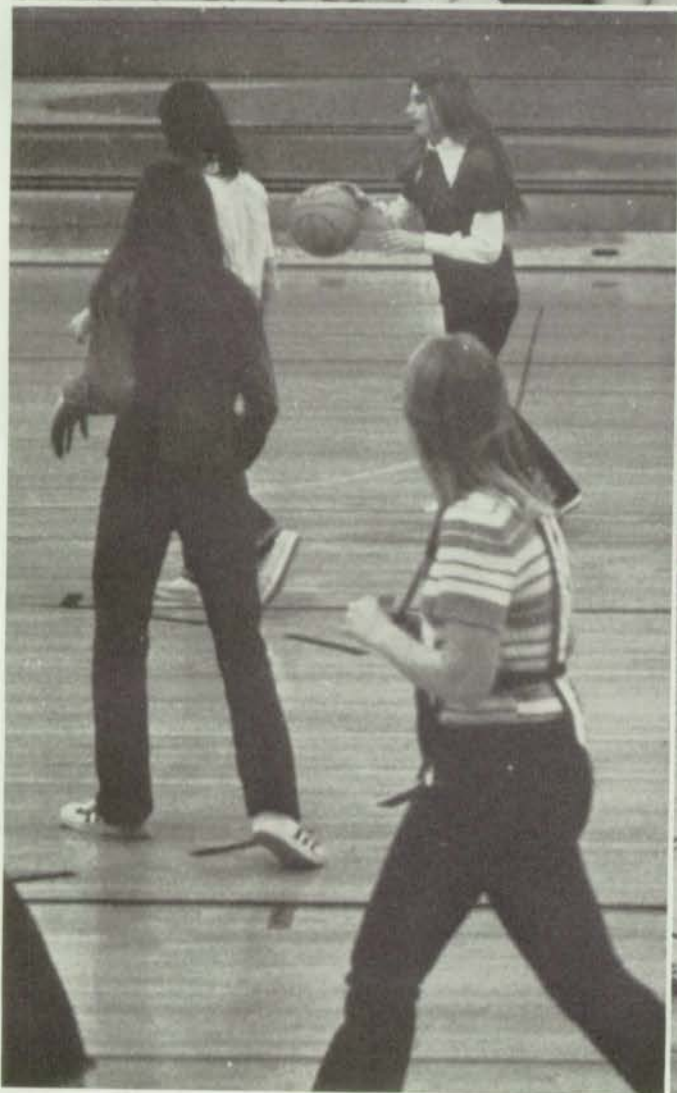

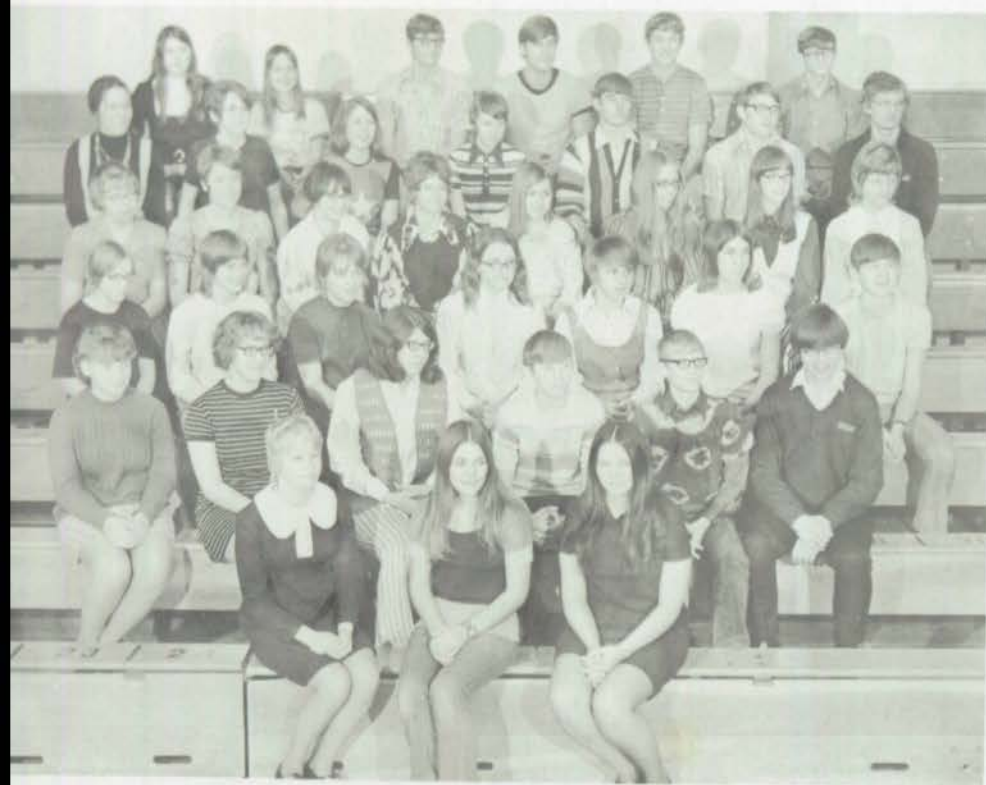

Keeping Our Heritage Alive

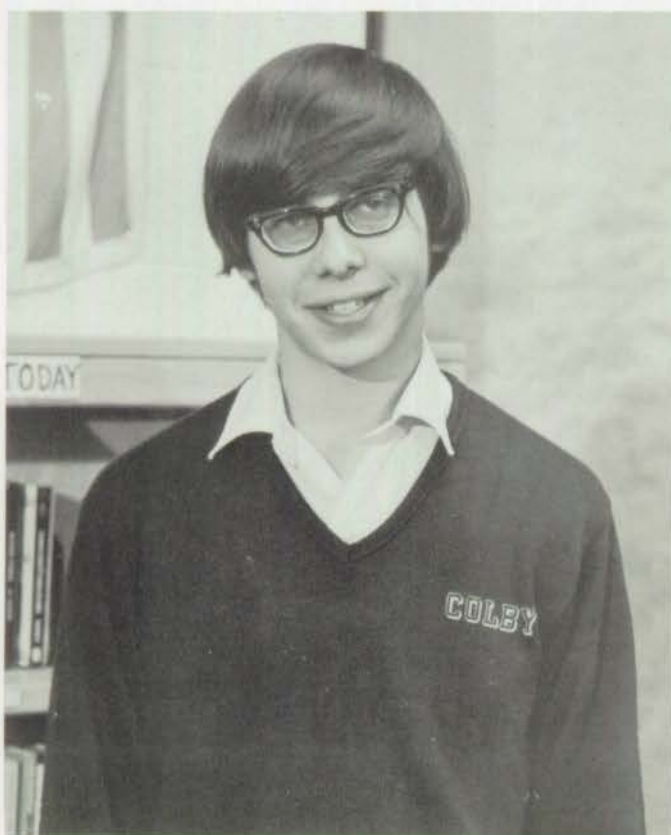

During the year, parties were sponsored for the retarded children and "Special Olympics" were held for the children to enter. In this way, the retarded child was

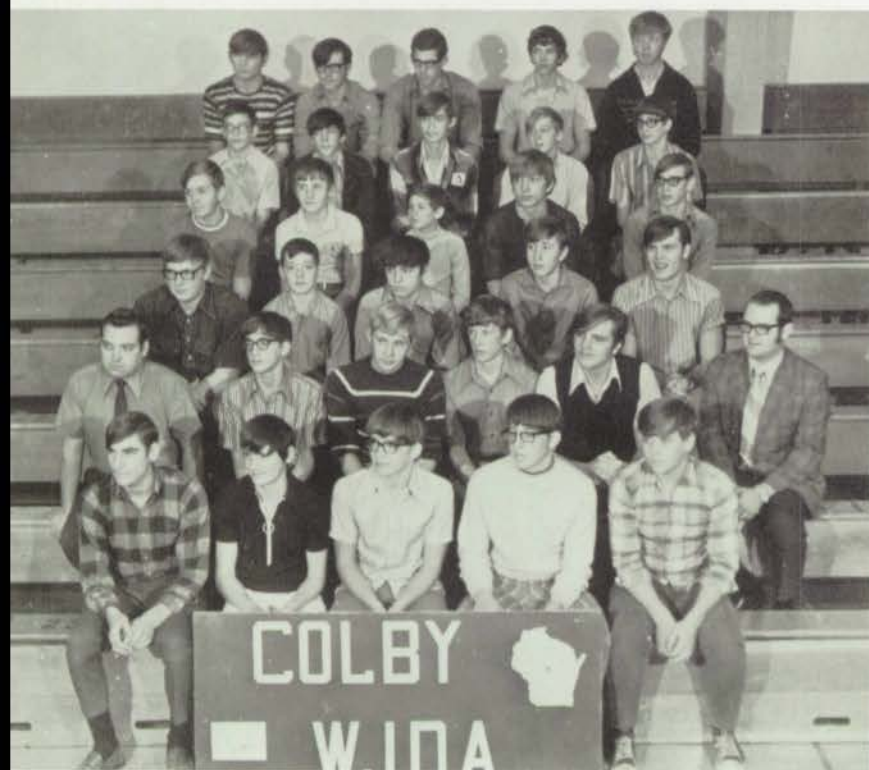
shown that somebody loved and cared about him.

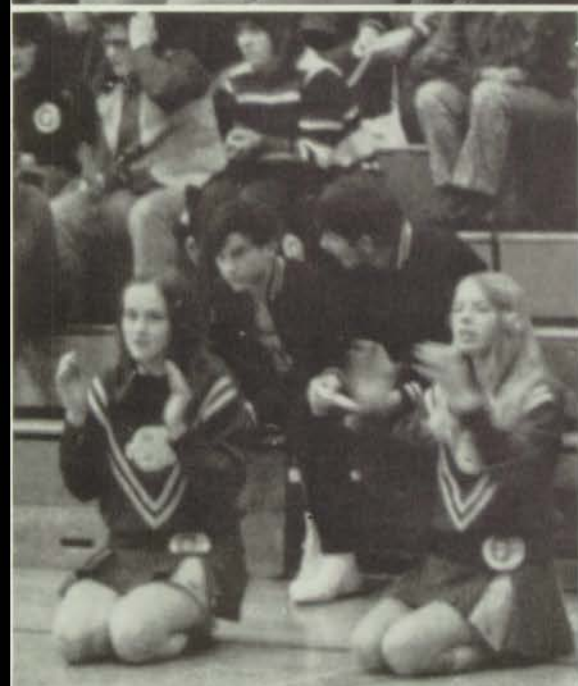

The Hornets had a total of seven victories and five defeats in duals and triangulars, and seven wins and nine losses in the larger meets. The climax of the season came when we won the Cloverbelt Conference championship in track.

and Bob Diedrich, 880 yard relay.

There were five Hornet track members that participated in the state meet. Jerry Eggebrecht ran the 880 yard run, Larry Schmidt the two mile, and Brian Eggebrecht the one mile run. Juniors Dave Dommer and Glen Goeltz high jumped and put the shot, respectively. Although the Hornets failed to receive a single point, valuable experience was gained by those who saw action at the state meet.

Hornets Sock It to 'Em on the Gridiron

Coach Duane Teska has plenty to be proud of this year. His Hornet gridmen perpetuated last year's season record of 9-1, but also captured an undisputed Cloverbelt Conference football championship. Throughout the season our Hornets amassed 245 points to 73 for their opponents.

The opening game of the season was against a weak Wittenberg-Birnamwood team; the Hornet offense shown as sophomore Gus Wenzel scored the first of his many varsity touchdowns and junior Randy Schultz led the rushing attack with 132 yards. The following week Colby met a La Crosse Logan team they had narrowly defeated the year before. An excellent passing game by quarterback Rich Dums and a strong defense were the keys in our 30-0 victory over the Rangers. Inter-divisional rivalry began when Colby defeated Cornell, outrushing the Chiefs 239 yards to 49. The Cornell team later took first place in the Cloverbelt west. The Colby Hornets encountered their only loss of the season at the hands of a strong Fall Creek squad. Although six players did not see action because of injury, our four-point loss was overshadowed by Randy Schultz's 156 yard rushing mark.

Conference action got underway on September 24th when the Hornets met a Greenwood Indian team that had quenched Colby's hopes for a conference championship last year. The Hornets avenged the loss with a 14-8 victory; Steve Brill and Gus Wenzel did a fine job of

holding the Greenwood defense. The following game marked the turning point of the season: the Hornets took sole possession of first place in our division by narrowly beating Loyal, 22-21. Colby players were psychologically up for the game but had a disappointment when it was rescheduled because of an electrical storm. Even so, defensive lineman Bill Neitzel played an outstanding game and senior Rich Dums spectacularly ran a kickoff back 91 yards to score for CHS. The Thorp game, highlight of our Homecoming celebrations, was easily won. A large number of reserves saw action in the contest in which the Big Green accumulated 315 yards rushing. The Hornets won their seventh game of the season over a young Owen-Withee squad. Senior lineman Glen Goeltz played a hard-hitting game, and Gus Wenzel led the defense with 15 tackles and an interception; our offense rushed for 376 yards. The season's end neared with a decisive game still to be played at Neillsville. The Indians had a definite size advantage over our Hornets and the meeting proved to be a see-saw battle. At the final whistle Colby was on top 14-7, shattering the hope of Neillsville in tying us for the division championship. The Hornets were in the playoffs—surprisingly in a battle against the Cornell Chiefs.

Constant rain poured on the gridiron the Saturday night of the contest. The Big Green outclassed the Cornell squad in a shut-out victory, climaxing a fine season with the Cloverbelt Conference Championship.

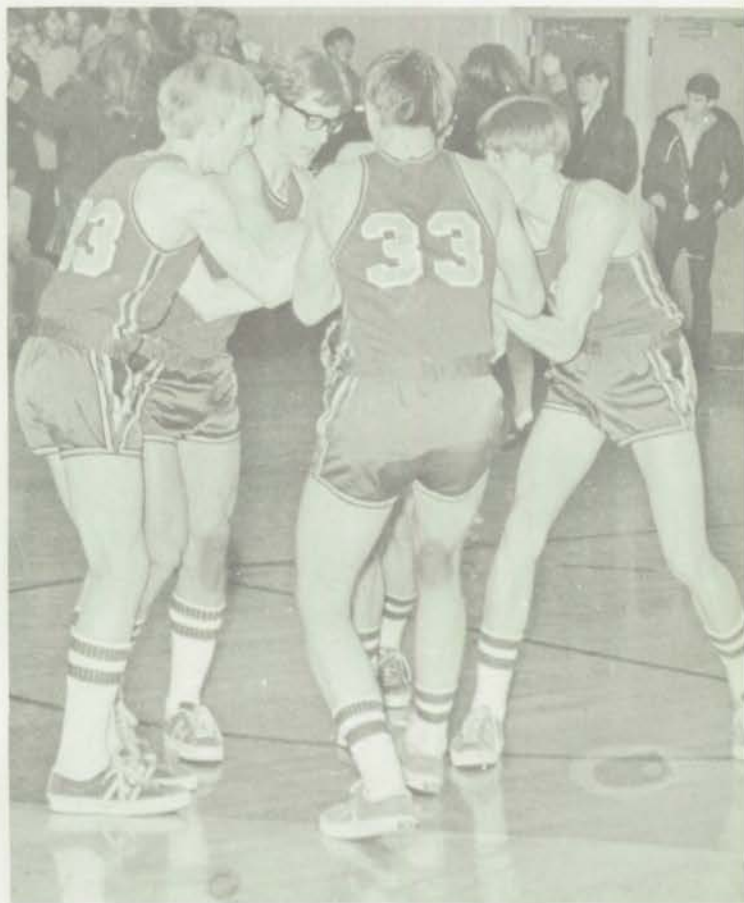

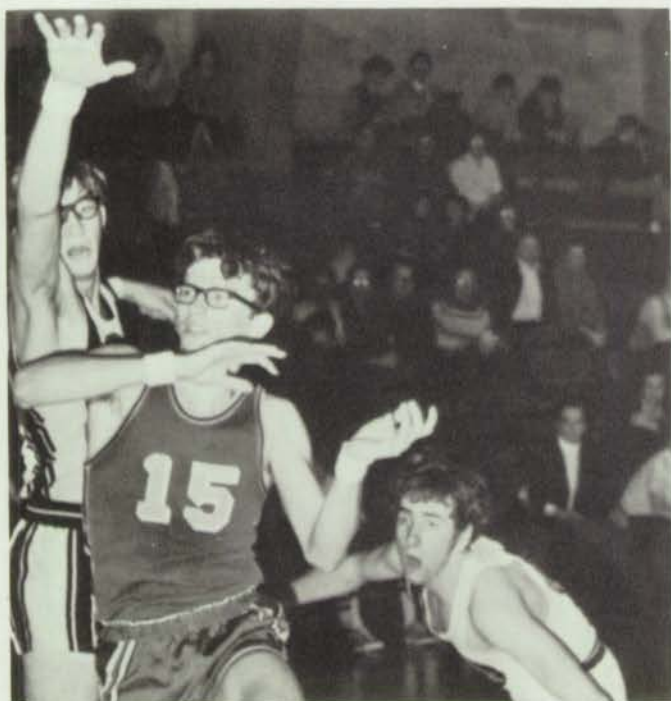


We're Number ONE!

This completes the wrestler's story.

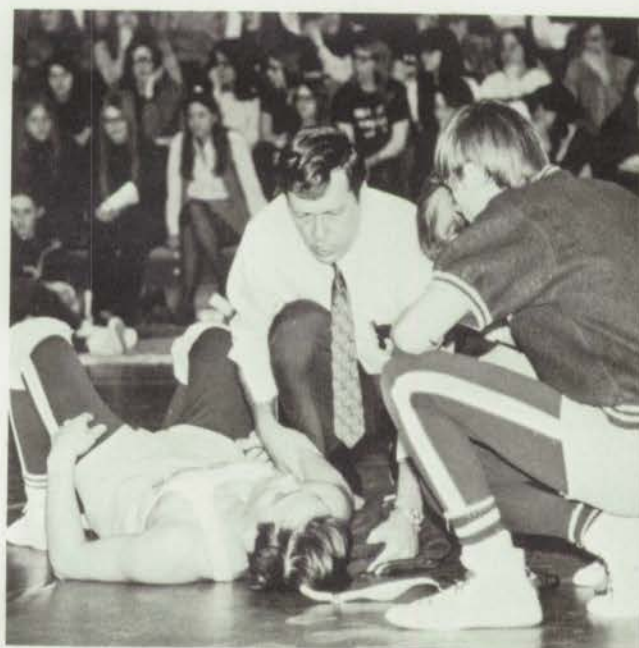

Harriers Just Miss Sectional Bid



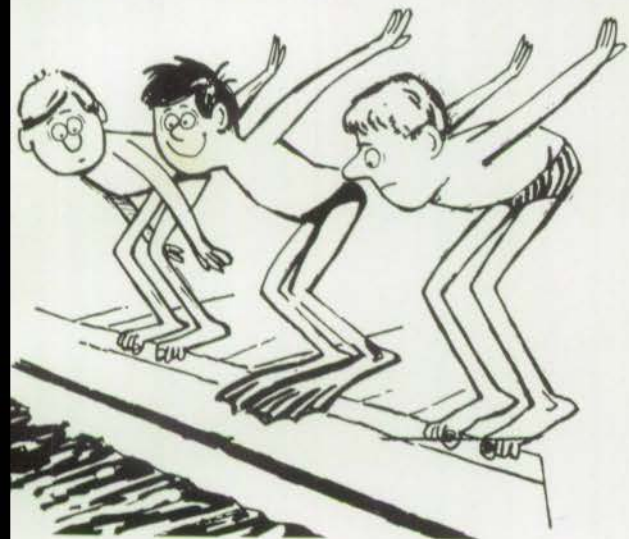

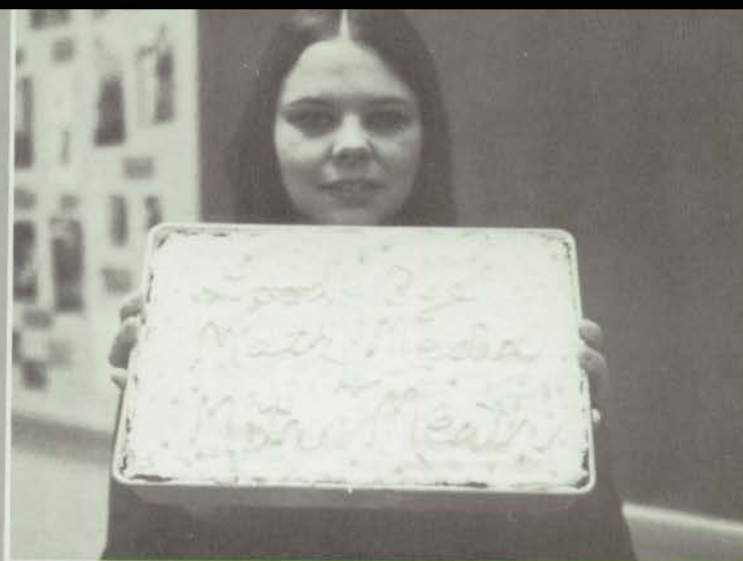

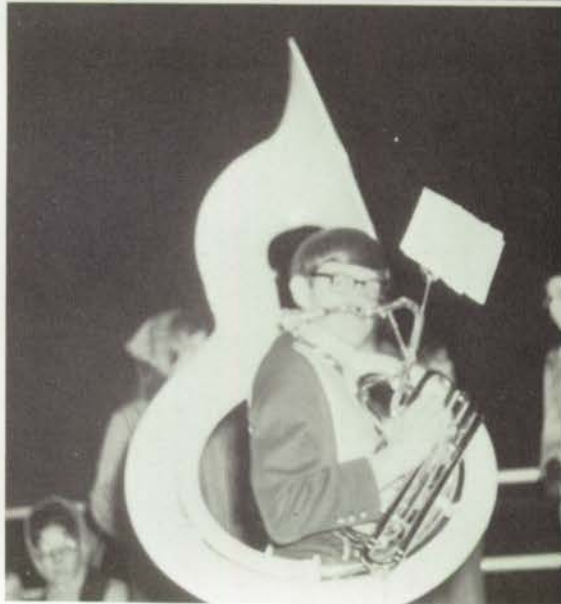
