




Government in Action


An Experience in State Government

All the members are looking forward to the spring rally, in which numerous schools will be invited to attend. French customs will be exibited and French foods will be served.
















FBLA Furthers Business Skills


NHS: Service to Humanity


Art Club Examines Masterpieces

Football Field of Fame

The 1972 football season was completed in true Hornet style as the Hornets captured the Cloverbelt Conference title for the second consecutive year.

Included with the conference title, trophy, and this year's outstanding team, came a proud head coach, Duane Teska. This season, the Hornets scored a total of 243 points, holding their opponents to 92 points.

Along with their eight hard-fought victories came one discouraging defeat. This game was played against Mondovi on September 1. Colby's final score was 26, and Mondovi's 32. The Hornets snapped back from this defeat only to win a wild offensive battle with Gilman on September 8. Randy Schultz proved to be the wheel-horse in Colby's offense, as he rushed for 205yards in 29 carries with Gus Wenzel adding 99 in 15 tries. The final score in the Cloverbelt Conference opener was Colby 27 to Gilman 14. On September 15, undefeated and unscored upon Stanley Boyd came to Colby with hopes of beating the Hornets. Colby com-

Pletely dominated all of the statistic departments: the Hornets led in first downs with 16 to 8, rushing 236 to only 50 for Stanley Boyd's, and 123 yards in the air on 8 out of 13 passes. The final outcome of the game was: Hornets 30, Stanley Boyd 7.

September 22, the Hornets traveled to Loyal for the two teams' annual grudge match. The final score was Colby 28 — Loyal 0. Kurt Mertens was the Hornets' leading rusher for 23 carries for 114 yards. Dave Sommer played sensationally for our Hornet defense, personally intercepting four of the five passes Loyal had stolen. By this win, Colby more or less put Loyal out of the running for the title. Thorp's game was defined as Colby's worst game, as they just sneaked past with a 14 to 11 win.

The Hornets tuned up for Owen-Withee's show-down on October 6 by defeating the Blackhawks 23 to 14. Randy Schultz was the leading rusher with 192 yards on 33 tries.

The 1972 Eastern Division Cloverbelt Conference football crown was at stake October 13, as the Hornets put their perfect 5-0 conference record on the line, the night Colby hosted Neillsville. Even if it was Friday the 13th, everything turned out well, as Colby celebrated a warm Homecoming victory with a score of 29 to 6.

The Hornets ended our 1972 football season with 7-1, when they rolled over Greenwood 32-8. Colby's leading rusher was Kurt Mertens with 189 on 27 carries.

The Hornets were really fired-up October 28th, as they scored three times within a 3 minute span in the first quarter, and then went on to whip Stanley Boyd with a score of 34 to 0, for the Cloverbelt Conference football crown. For the Hornets this was their second straight Cloverbelt Conference win under the leadership of Coach Duane Teska.












This year's varsity team had a tough schedule. However, their spirits remained high throughout their challenging season, and their fans remained faithful throughout the trying season.
