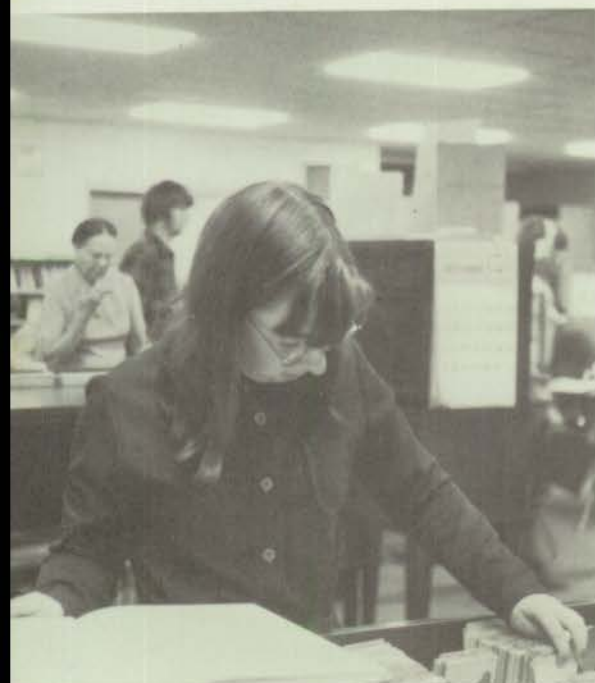
A Librarian: Considerate, Loyal, Dedicated

Badger Boys

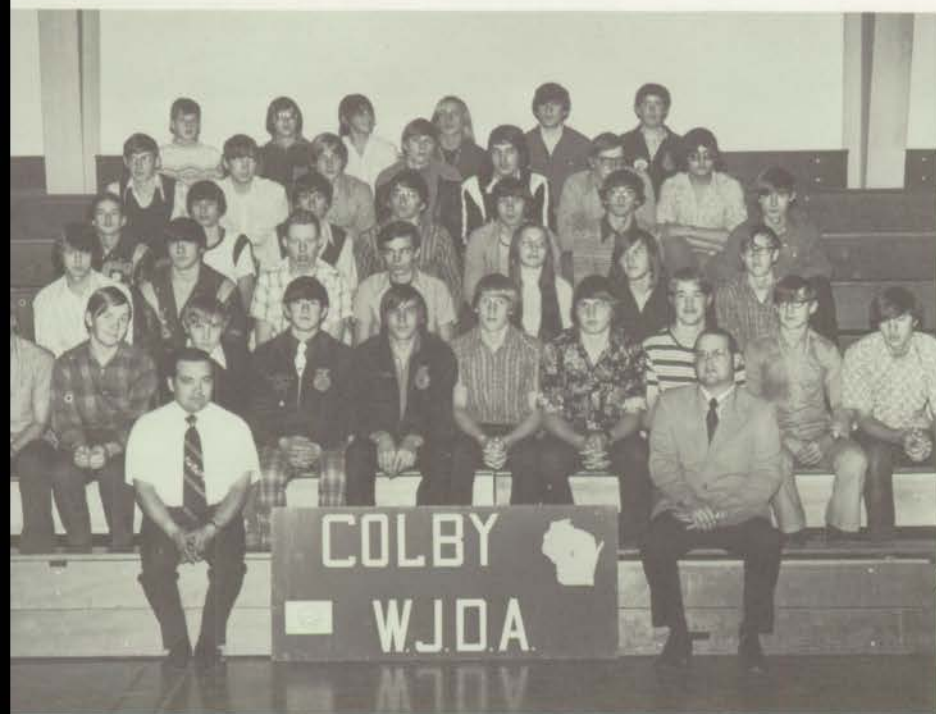

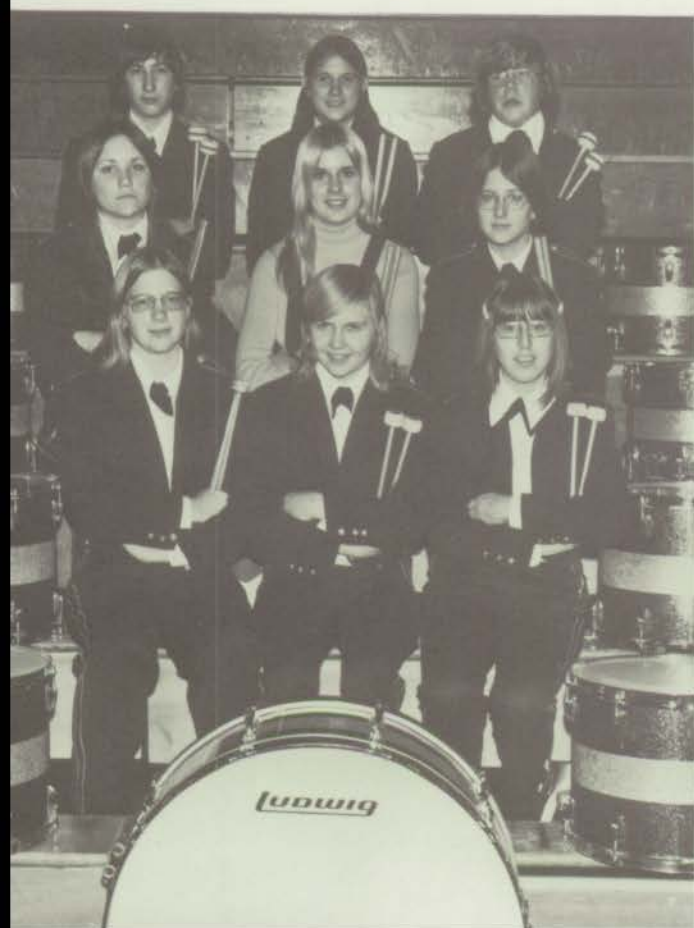

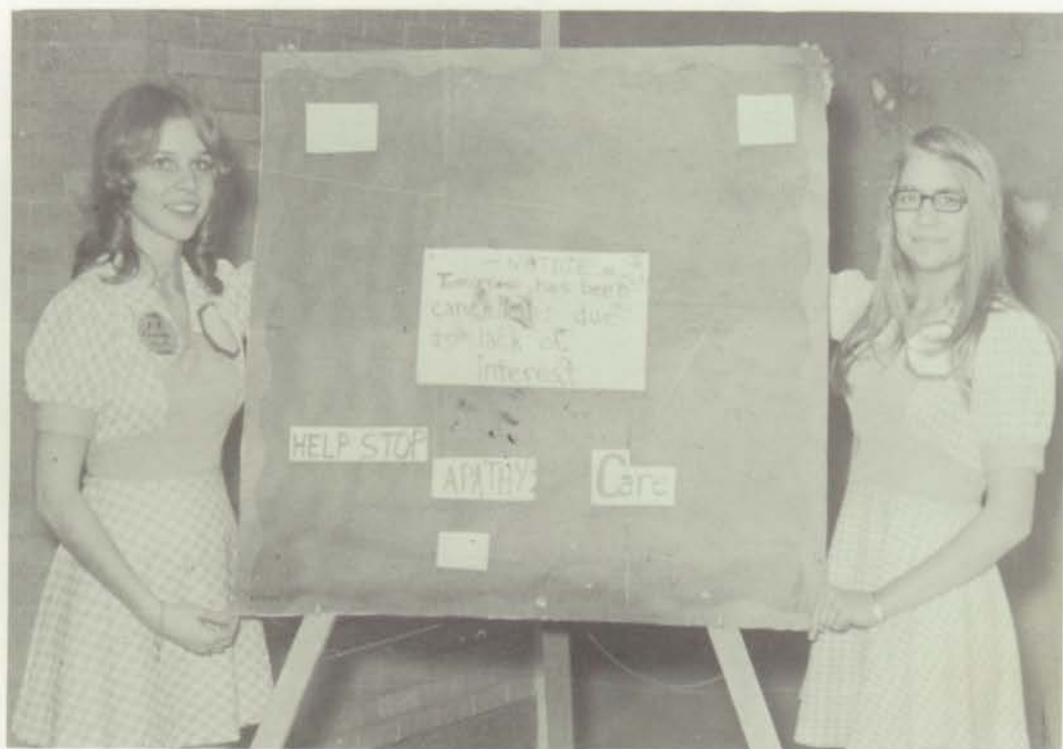


The Future Homemakers of America is made up of girls in grades 9-12 who have had at least one semester of Home Economics.

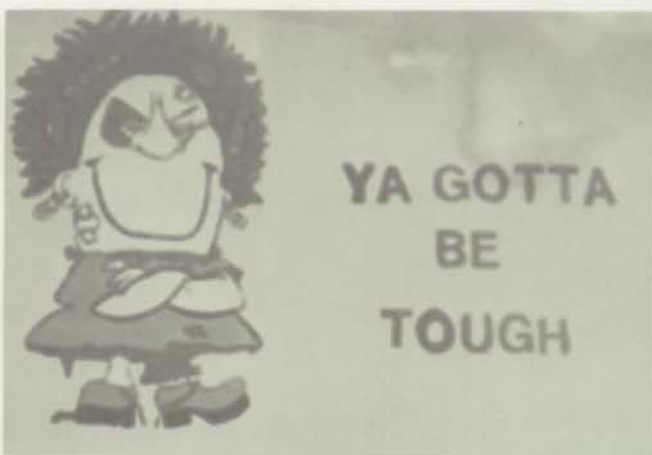


Pep Club: Arousing Interest

Lettermen: The Cream of the Crop!



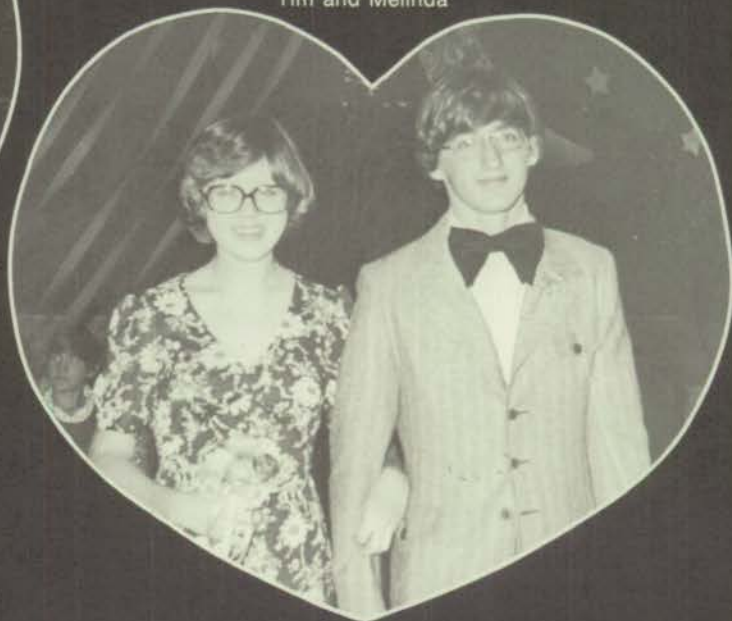

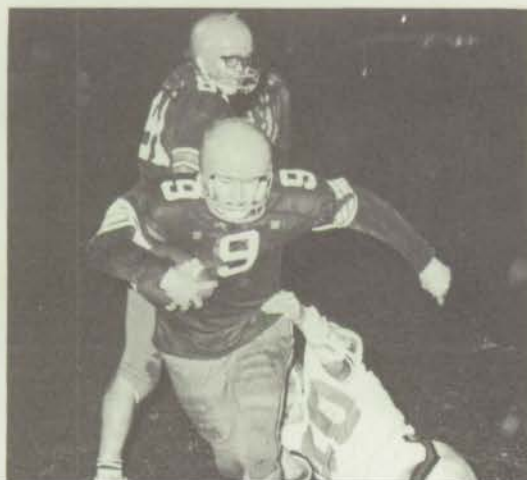
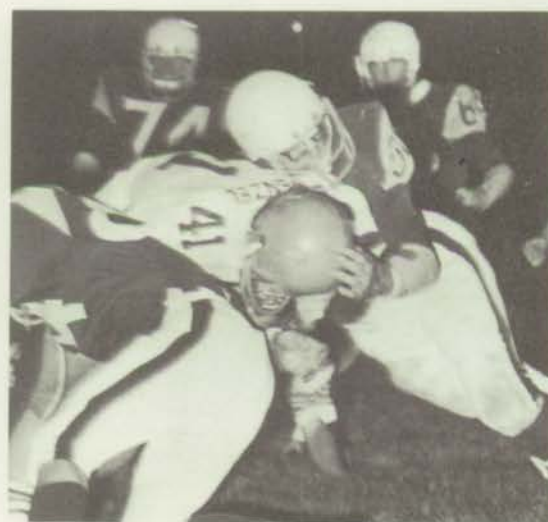
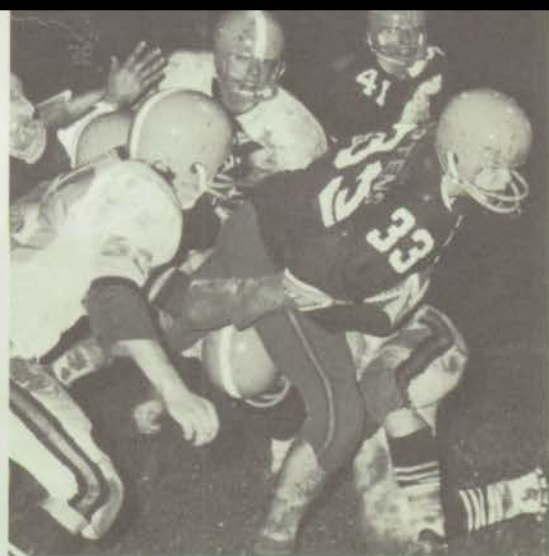
This year's Colby Hornet Team was undefeated 9-0. Colby's almost all senior team showed how football should be played.

Again this year, Colby won the Cloverbelt Conference title, making it four years in a row.

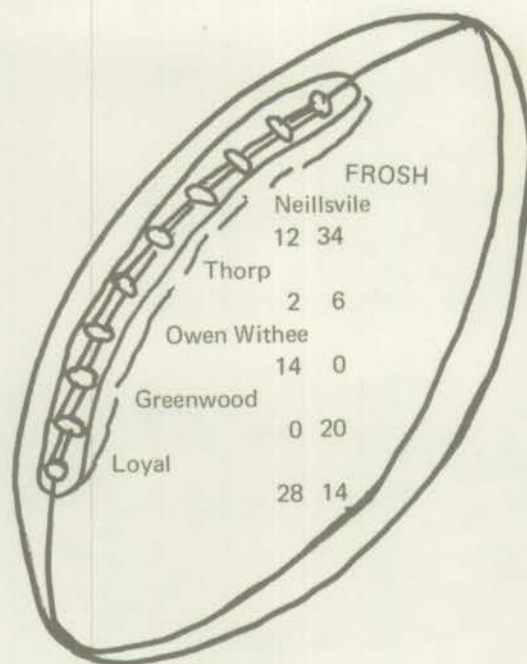
Colby launched seven guys to All Conference.

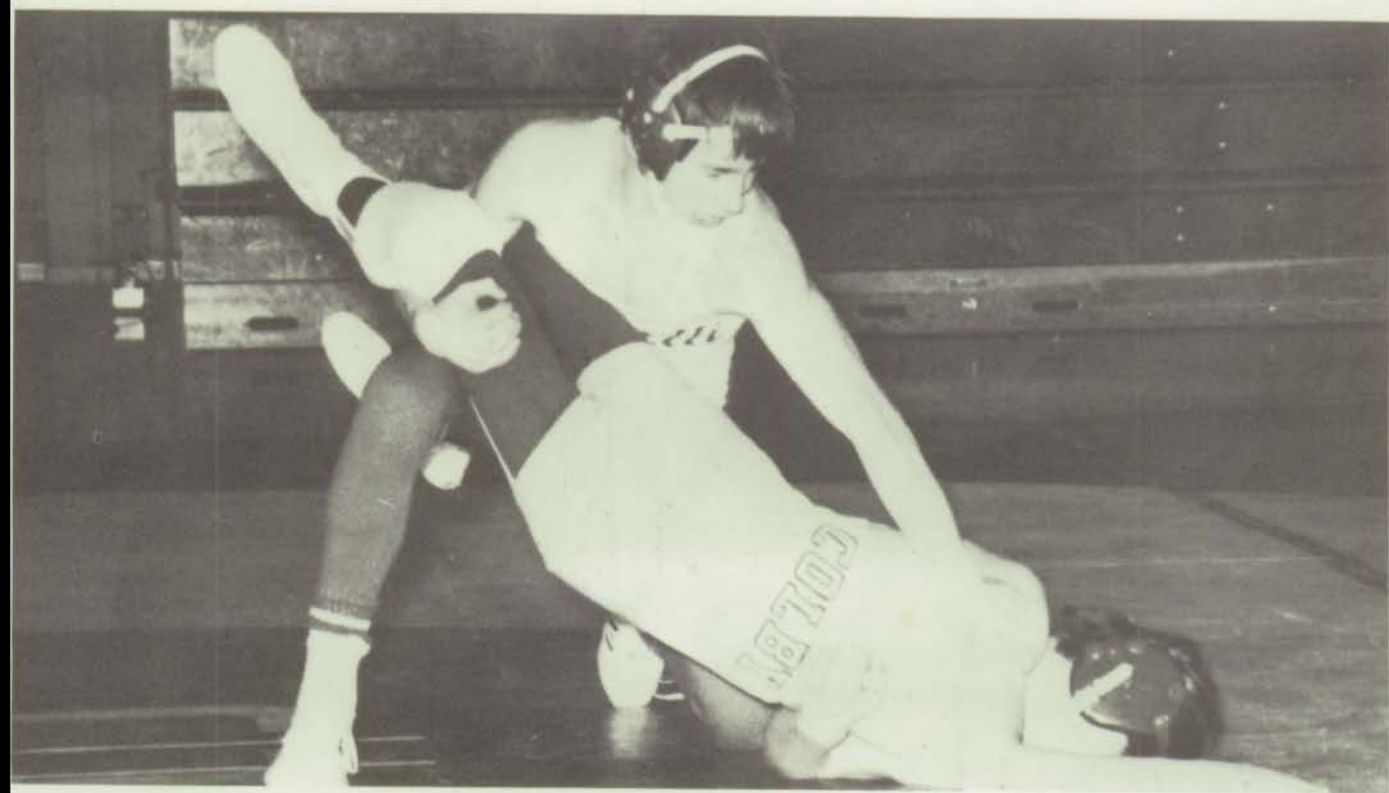
With the patience of an optimistic coach and the effort of everyone on the team, the Colby Hornet Grapplers were a tough team to beat.
