Librarians Are Bookies



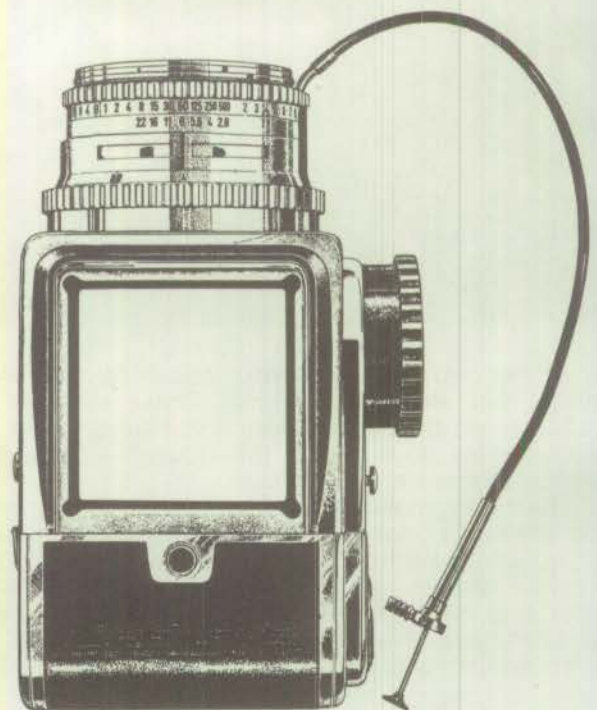

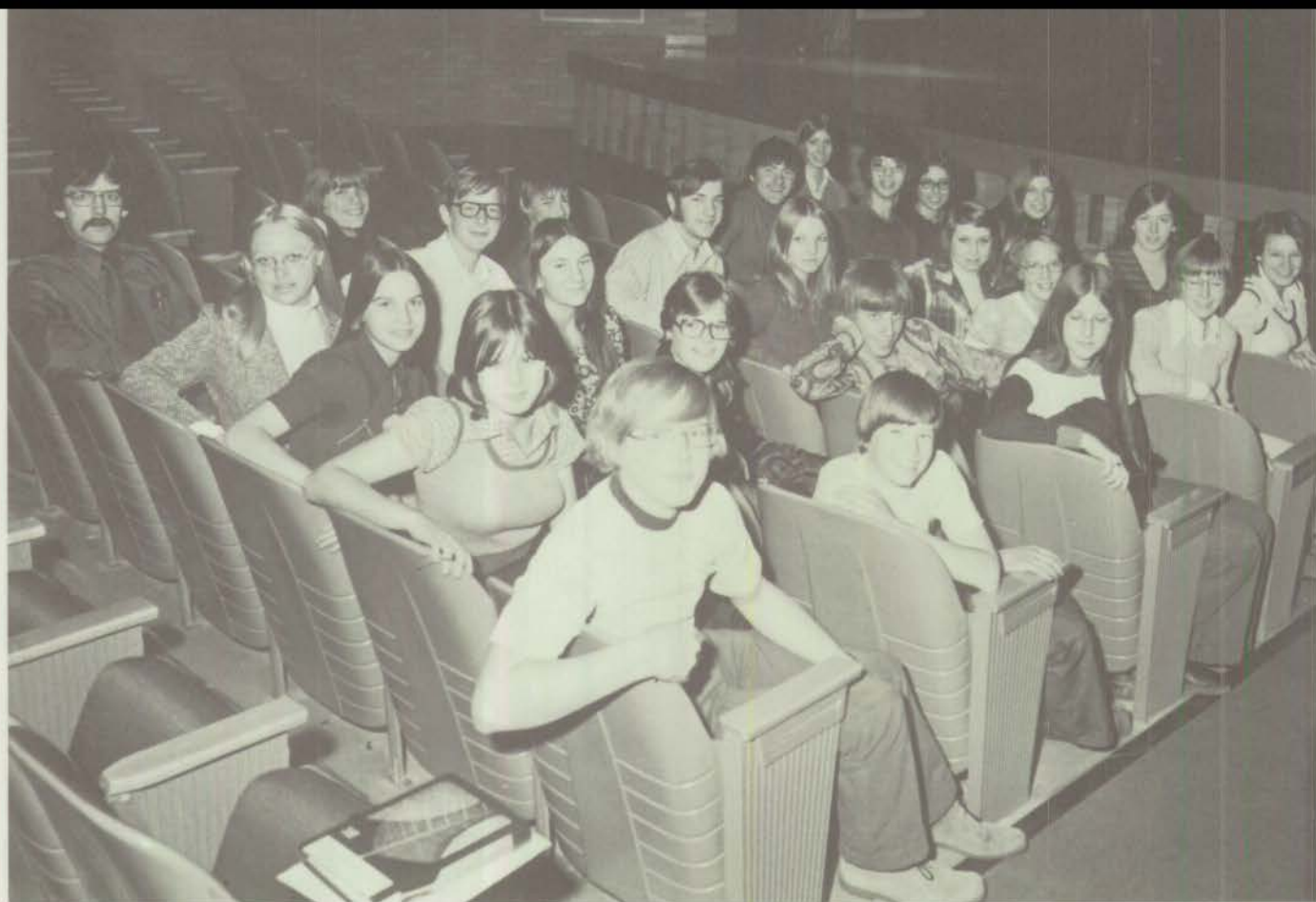


FBLA: They've Got a Head for Business!

The season started out with a month of hard practice. Coach La Sota did this to build up the team's endurance and work on things such as turns and starts.


At the intersquad meet, all that hard work paid off, by having every record fall. There were also many individual efforts bettered from the previous year.
