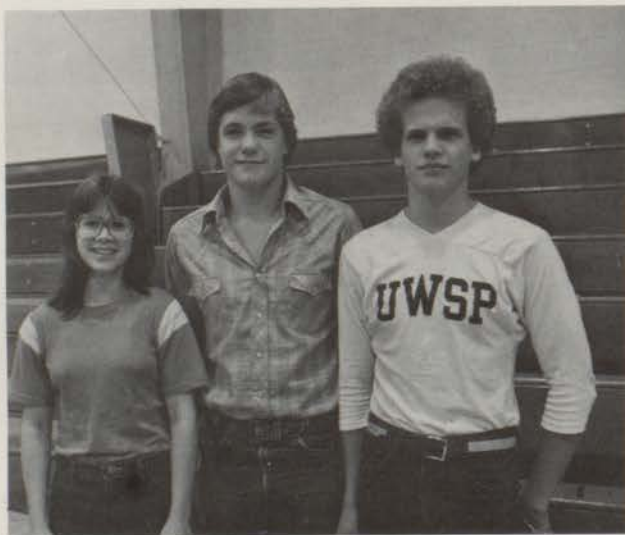


Kids in the A-V club are active in photography and video taping. They also learn how to repair films, and they go around and find equipment that has been checked out of the A-V room, if it is needed.
