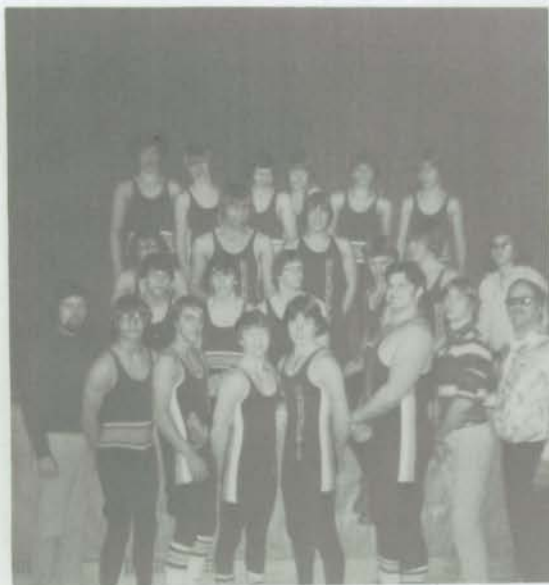
This year, the boys swim team was under the coaching of Miss Debra Garland. She described her team "small with quality swimmers, with the majority of the swimmers dedicated."

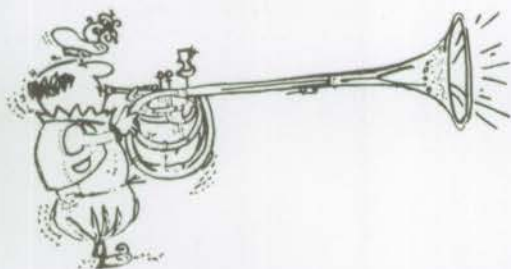
