
During her years at Colby High, Mrs. Haavisto taught courses in typing, shorthand, accounting, and geography. She also served as FBLA and class advisors.


In her spare time she enjoys reading, fishing, sewing, knitting, and gardening.



Pep Club advisors felt pleased with the increased participation of students in varied activities and were also happy with the concept of honoring all the fall sports. They






Joelle Mainfroid is our exchange student from Liege, Belgium. She began her studies at Colby on September 23 and she is also a senior.





Our cross country team also works with grade school students to build their interest in running. This program, called Run for Fun, takes place during the cross country season.








