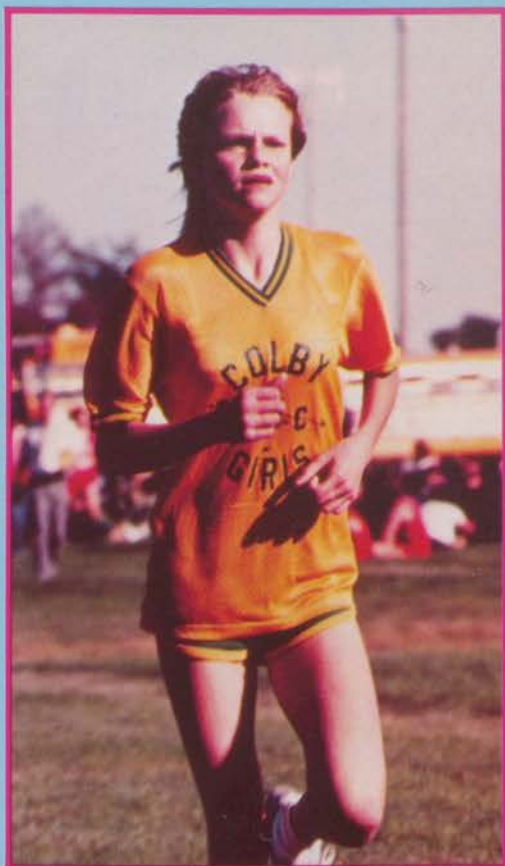

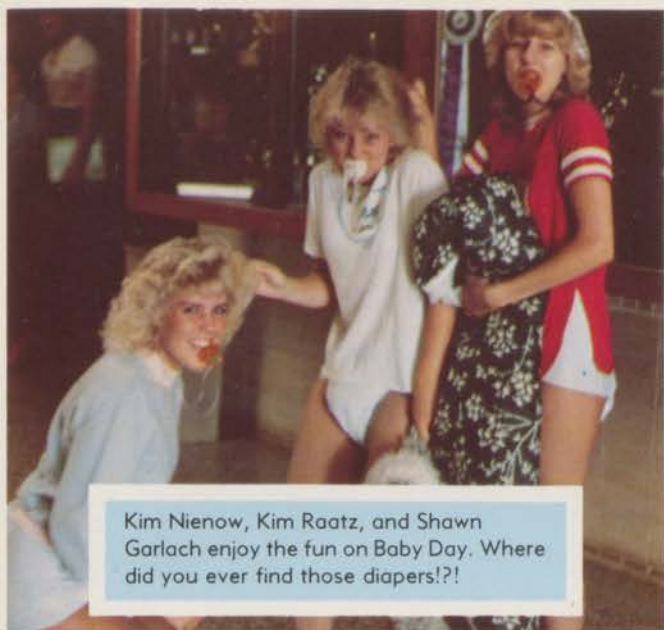

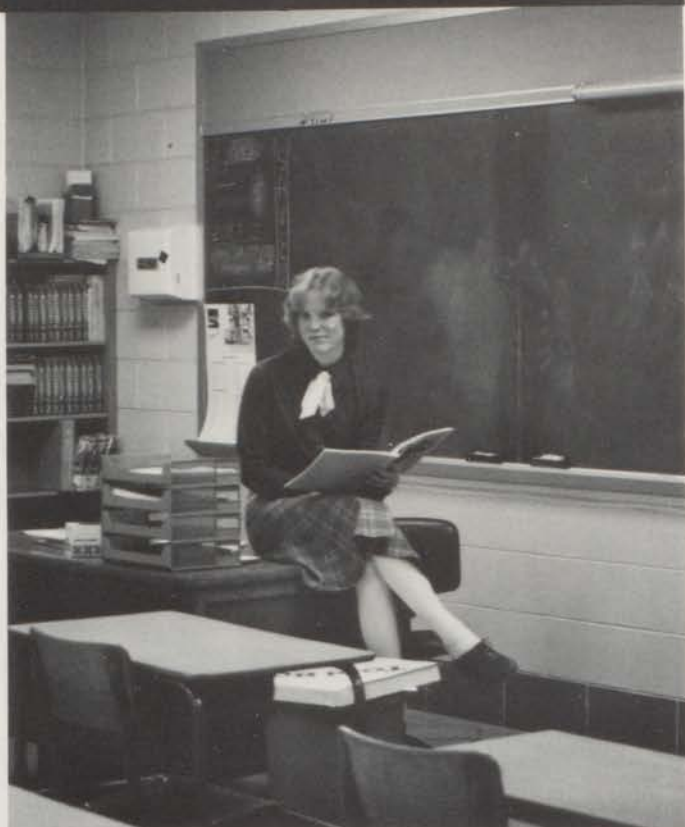
# Teacher Arrives At Semester
