

**7** The second year of the Lollapalooza Tour, part rock concert, part circus, featured rapper Ice Cube along with Pearl Jam, the Red Hot Chili Peppers and others. The Concourse of Oddities and Curiosities drew the alternative crowd.

**5** The Toronto Blue Jays took the World Series, winning against the Atlanta Braves, four games to two. In the 11th inning of the final game, Dave Winfield drove in two runs to lead the Blue Jays to a 4-3 victory.





## CO/EXTRACURRICULAR CODE DECODED

What is the document that rules the private lives of 65% of CHS students, but that nearly none of these people really understand? It's the Colby Co/Extracurricular Code of Conduct.

At the beginning of the school year, all students sign a form which in layman's terms says: don't drink, don't smoke, don't do drugs, or you're in trouble. Although that is the main gist of it, there are a lot more details which students should be aware of. Because more people read this paper than the 9-page explanation of the code, I will try to highlight some parts of the code in this article.

According to the code, the purpose of it is to provide expectations for student behavior, and students who engage in disruptive behavior will subject themselves to the penalties of the code.

In an interview with Mr. John Hocking, CHS Principal, stated that the new code is basically the same as the old athletic code that only applied to athletics. He explained that the feeling in the school and the community was that penalties given to athletes should also apply to non-athletes.

The example that was given was that if a basketball player and a non-player were caught drinking a beer on the street, the basketball player would be suspended for four games and the nonplayer would not be punished.

The new code takes the old athletic code and applies its principles to students in all extracurricular activities. The code defines extracurricular activities as those which are non-academic, school-affiliated activities which include time spent only outside the regular school day.

Behaviors that are violations of the code include violations of the following chapters of the Wisconsin State Statutes: Chapter 125, "alcoholic beverages"; Chapter 161, uniform controlled substances act; Chapters 939-948, "criminal code"; possession/use of any tobacco product; or any activity which results in out-of-school suspension, or the willful and persistent, disruptive behavior which interferes with the educational process.

Thirty-five percent of CHS students don't participate in any sports or any clubs, and therefore are not punished by the code. These individuals, if caught violating the code, are not allowed to come to any school-sponsored activities for 20 consecutive school days.

Penalty for violation is determined by two criteria: if the individual has any previous offenses and if the infraction was at a school-sponsored event or not. All penalties are automatically doubled if they occur at a school-sponsored event. First offenses carry a penalty of removal from school activities for 20 school days; second offenses carry a 40 day suspension from activities and third offenses require a one-calender year suspension from school activities.

All students involved in athletics must follow these penalties, plus they must accumulate points which are earned by not participating in games that they would normally participate in. Different sports are weighted differently on the points system. Basketball games have a value of five points each; swimming, volleyball, wrestling, baseball and softball have a value of 7 points for each contest; and each football, track, or cross country event has a value of 9 points. First offenses require the accumulation of 18 points; second offenses, 36, third offenses require a suspension from all athletic contests for one calendar year; and fourth offenses terminate scholastic competition for that individual. In order for points to be accumulated for the first two offenses, the athlete must continue to practice, complete assigned managerial tasks and the athlete must complete the season in that sport.

From our interviews with several students, these reporters feel that students have some misconceptions about the code, and its purpose, and we hope we have cleared up some of these misconceptions in this article. There are, however, some things that we as students and athletes do see as shortcomings in the code.

One of these is the policy for the reporting of incidents. Although this vehicle has not been used as of yet, we think that if it ever is used, there could be some problems.

The code states that any person over 21 years of age can make an accusation against a student. At the time of the report, an investigation will begin into the incident.

The problem we see that could present itself is that if someone had an ulterior motive to get an athlete off the playing field or the court, all they would have to do is make an accusation, and the athlete would automatically be suspended from all activities pending the hearing.

Another thing we heard from students was that they didn't like the idea that the code is in affect during the summer months. They also didn't think that the law allows you the right to do something, such as drink with your parents, or smoke if you are 18, the code shouldn't take those rights away.

There are some flaws in the code, but if you really look at it and think about what is fair and right for students in high school, we think that you will see that for the most part the code does a good job of providing guidelines for the lives of student and athletes, and helps to keep the image of Colby High School and it's students clean.

### ACADEMIC LETTERS UPDATED

In 1978, a faculty member at CHS saw the need for students, who were outstanding academic achievers, to be recognized in some way. For two years, Gaith Caskey (former CHS Guidance Counselor and teacher), along with the 1978-79 National Honor Society officers, had discussed the issue of awarding academic letters to students who met the requirements set . . .

Today, Caskey is still in strong favor of this honor being awarded and commented, "students should be recognized for their academic achievements. I think this is a very special program and also something very important to have in schools."

Athletes have been and still are being recognized for their performances in sports. Pep rallies and awards banquets are held in their honor and Caskey felt that academic achievers deserved this same recognition.

Students needed to meet specific requirements in order to be eligible for an academic letter. The first year, letters were awarded to seniors who were on the "A" honor roll all four years of high school, but eventually this was changed. Anyone who had been on the "A" honor roll for one year qualified.

Eligibility was determined on the student's semester grades. If the student could maintain an "A" average the following year, they would receive a chevron(bar) to pin on their letter. "This was done instead of giving the students a new letter each time they earned one," Caskey replied.

The issue of having "B" average students earn different colored academic letters was brought up and discussed, but nothing ever came of it. Caskey opposed the idea strongly and stated, "If we would have offered this, over 60% of CHS students would've qualified for a letter. Overall, we wanted this honor ("A" academic letter) to really mean something, not to be just for anyone. We were trying to get other students inspired to try harder and earn a letter for being on the 'A' honor roll."

No problems were ever evident, as far as academic letters went, until the 1992-1993 school year, when it was brought to everyone's attention that academic letters hadn't been awarded in four years. One concerned parent mentioned this fact at a CHS Parent's Club meeting, in hopes of getting things back on track. Joyce Laesch was quite aware of this problem at the time, and stated, "I wouldn't put the blame on anyone. Academic letters were handled by Caskey and after she left CHS, obviously no one took over in her place."

A committee was formed, consisting of principal John Hocking; two faculty members, Amy Hartfeldt and Al Braun; two parents, Patricia Kampmeyer and Laesch; two junior class representatives, Jenny Kilty and Jason Treutel; two senior class representatives, Kim Haas and Becky Reamer.

This group worked together to set new qualifications for receiving an academic letter, which are still in effect today: 1) freshman that are on the "A" Honor Roll for the first three quarters qualify for a letter, and 2) sophomores, juniors, and seniors that have a cumulative of 3.50 or above qualify for a letter.

G.P.A.'s will be determined at the end of the 3rd, 5th, and 7th semester. Any senior having a G.P.A. at 3.66 or above after seven semesters will be recognized for academic excellence at graduation.

The selected committee also made sure that last spring everyone who earned a letter or chevron (indicating a second-year letter winner) received it at Awards Night. Laesch commented, "It was just a matter of catching up and hopefully things will stay this way in the future. I'm very happy that the kids who earned letters and chevrons, finally got them."

#### CLINTON MAY RULE U.S., BUT PEROT RULES CHS

As part of a project to teach teens the importance of voting the Colby Junior High School held a mock election at the time of this year's presidential election. It started about a month before the actual election, when eighth grade students began decorating the halls with campaign signs for the incumbent president George Bush, the democratic challenger Bill Clinton and the independent candidate Ross Perot.

Students constructed a common polling place in the guidance office. They built booths and decorated them patriotically. They obtained a list of all the students in school and separated them by grade. Each grade became a ward, which was used to make the election feel realistic and measure what percent of each class voted. Students also made ballots and ballot boxes. When November third came, eighth grade students took turns registering voters and making sure election laws were followed.

The results of the mock election were as follows:

Perot won by a large margin with 50%, or 245 votes. Clinton was in a distant second with 27%, or 143 votes. Bush had a close third with 20%, or 97 votes. An average of 80% of the total students in CHS voted. This is very high when compared to the 55% of all eligible American voters. The seventh grade voted the most, averaging 94%, while the sophomores voted the least, at 61%.

Members of the staff and faculty also voted. Of the 40 that did, half gave their vote to Bill Clinton, which was similar to the national vote. George Bush and Ross Perot both received 25 % of the faculty vote.

#### CHS GRADUATES FAVOR PRAYER

In a long-awaited decision, the United States Supreme Court on June 24, 1992, in a five to four decision authorized by Justice Kennedy, ruled that clergy who offer prayers as part of an official public school graduation ceremony are forbidden by the Establishment Clause of the United States Constitution.

The case the justices decided, *Lee vs. Weisman*, stemmed from a controversy in Providence, Rhode Island, where the school system had traditionally permitted middle school and high school principals to invite clergy to give invocations and benedictions at graduation ceremonies.

Despite the U.S. Supreme Court decision, Oostburg Area Public Schools will continue to have prayers at graduation ceremonies.

According to an edition of the Marshfield News Herald, Oostburg School Superintendent Marvin Hopland stated, "I think that it's too bad when a local minority can challenge something that is contrary to the values and the wishes of the majority in a community." He also commented that the law hasn't changed in 20 years and Oostburg won't do anything different than they have done in those 20 years.

Not all schools have come to such a conclusion. CHS schoolboard officials voted 4-2 in favor of banning school sponsored prayer at graduation. This decision was based on an opinion given by CHS attorney, Jeffrey Jones. He advised that we not have school sponsored prayer at graduation based upon the Supreme Court's ruling. He also noted that a school district who offers prayers as part of an official school graduation ceremony, or other school functions, would violate the Establishment Clause of the United States Constitution. The Court's holding effects only school-sponsored prayer and does not prohibit teaching about religion, allowing religious groups or clubs to meet on school premises during non-school hours, or other purely educational forums.

According to the Forrest T. Jones & Company, group insurance administrators, the School Leaders Errors and Omissions policy will defend claims arising from prayer. But if it is found that the board members acted in "wanton and willful disregard of the law or of the rights of others and are assessed with punitive damages," the policy will not pay those punitive damages. Typically, punitive damages are awarded against individuals.

School boards from all Wisconsin public schools were informed to review their policies and practices concerning prayer at commencement and similar school-sponsored events in light of the new decision.

The National School Boards Association (NSBA) encouraged school districts to take these steps immediately after the Court's ruling:

1. Obtain an opinion from the school district's legal counsel so the community can be assured the school board is not taking action precipitously, but is merely conforming to the "law of the land."

2. Based on the opinion of legal counsel, formally amend all policies that allow prayer at school events and adopt a policy consistent with the law.

3. Encourage community groups to help explain the decision to the public. The explanation should make clear that the decision affects only school-sponsored prayer. It does not prohibit teaching about religion, allowing religious clubs to meet on school premises during non-school hours, and other purely educational forums.

4. If the board schedules a public meeting to discuss the case, have school attorneys present to answer questions.

5. Contact churches, synagogues and other religious groups in the community to inform them of the decision and the school board's new policy on graduation prayers.

CHS principal John Hocking thinks the board is "acting effectively in such a hardspot." He also believes that people should keep in mind the possibility of a two-year legal battle, with taxpayers paying millions of dollars, if the board would allow school-sponsored prayer at graduation.

On the other hand, some people may end up revolting if CHS goes along with the Supreme Court decision and other schools go against it and nothing happens.

As far as Hocking knows, student speakers at graduation are able to speak freely as long as their words are not disruptive to the ceremony. A logical question has been brought up, "Who would be liable if the student speaker would ask for a moment of silence and prayer during his/her speech?" There is not just one answer to this question. If school officials were not aware of the student's selection of words, then the student would be liable and vice versa. If the school was held liable, things could get rough, but if the student were held liable, not much could be done.

According to the First Amendment of the US Constitution, there is still such a thing as "freedom of speech."

Hocking was honest with his feelings and stated, "I really don't have an answer. No one does. Quite frankly, I'm thinking of getting sick with the flu or something on graduation night. It's sad. I really don't want graduation to be ruined."

Hocking realizes that it may not be possible to be sick on graduation night, and has come up with one personal solution in the likely case that a student speaker would ask for a moment of silence and prayer. "I'll bow my head and pray."
