#### Colby Public Library: Build for the Community...Build for the Future

The Colby Public Library (CPL), in partnership with the City of Colby, is over three quarters of the way to its goal of raising \$2.2 million for a new library facility!

# Background

- CPL was founded in December 1879 and is celebrating 137 years of continuous service.
- CPL moved to its current location, the remodeled fire station portion of City Hall, in 1991.
- In January 2016, anonymous donors provided \$500,000 toward a new library building.
- The City of Colby pledged to match the donation, and this created a \$1 million starter fund.
- A building committee was formed in February 2016.
- The donors pledged another \$300,000 to ensure a building that meets current and future needs..
- In April, the Colby School District Education Center land was chosen as the site for the new library.
- Based on the architect's study, the estimated cost of a new library building is \$2.2 million.
- In August, the City of Colby was awarded a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) of \$500,000.
- \$1.8 million is pledged to the Colby Library Building Fund.
- Contributions from additional community and business partners are being sought to reach our Capital Campaign Goal of \$400,000.



## Library Space Has Outgrown Service Needs

**Present Location**: 2,400 sq. ft. in the 64-year-old City Hall has served the community for 25 years.

- Available library space is inadequate to support community demand for services.
- Many areas in the library are not accessible to physically challenged patrons using wheelchairs or walkers.
- CPL collection size has reached capacity with over 27,000 items including books, magazines, newspapers, music, and video collections.
- The collection cannot increase to meet demand; each new item purchased means that a current item must be discarded to make room on the shelf.
- CPL circulated over 75,000 items in 2015, representing over 25% of Clark County library use.
- Services to CPL's 2,390 cardholders include printers and copy machines, scanners, a microfilm reader, and fax machine.
- Space only allows for 5 internet computers which are in constant use for online classes, testing, job searches, research, and social contacts.
- Available space severely limits program offerings for children, adults and families.

# **Current Space Concerns at the CPL**



We have outgrown our community room for our summer reading program.



Each year, our Cheese Days Book Sale gets more and more donations. The community room is no longer a large enough space for this annual event.



We have had to move our summer reading program finale to the Lion's Shelter and have almost outgrown that space, too!





Our space for children's programming is limited!








We have claimed areas in the City Hall, which are meeting spaces, to store items for book sales and programming.

## The City of Colby Proposes to Build a New Library

**New Location**: 10,600 sq. ft. building on West Spence Street (former school district land). The current District Education Center will be demolished.

#### A new Colby Library will:

- Meet the codes for physically challenged patrons to comply with the American Disabilities Act.
- Supply more area for public Internet access and enhance available technology.
- Expand shelving capacity to maintain a vibrant collection of materials for all ages.
- Provide adequate space for children's programming including story times, class visits, summer reading program, educational entertainers, movie nights, craft days, and community service projects.
- Create ample space for adult programming including book clubs, craft and hobby nights, adult classes, volunteer opportunities, open houses, civic service projects, speakers, book to movie nights, and fundraisers.
- Offer rooms for individual study and small group consultations.
- Be a community center promoting educational and cultural opportunities.
- Offer the safety feature of off-street parking.


