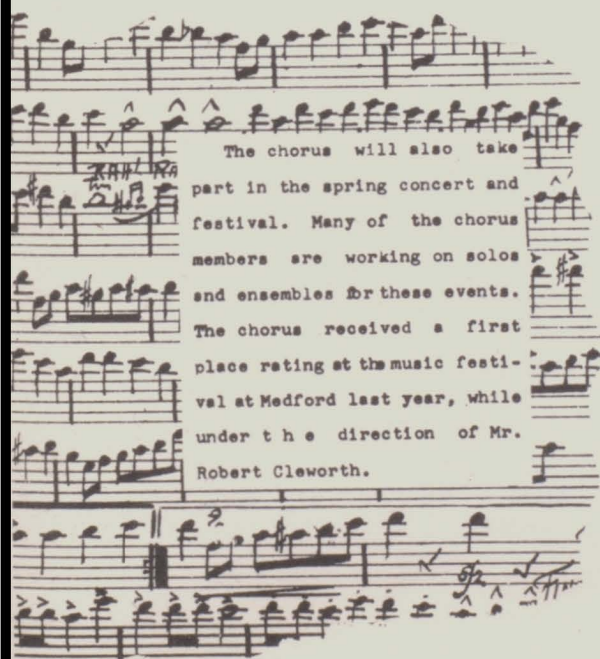


MIXED CHORUS
