When reaching the 1000 book level, a travel reading pillow and book is awarded. Due to parent requests, we have 2000, 3000, and 4000 Books Before (the end of) Kindergarten binders also available. All these programs promote child literacy and help children hear the recommended 21,000 words each day.
