### **FoodSculpture Results**

Over 3,000 food items were donated to CUP Food Pantry in Colby and to Trinity Food Pantry in Unity. Sixteen displays filled the RCU Community Room at the Colby Community Library during the month of November. Over 300 patrons and visitors voted on their favorite FoodSculpture. The winners were 1<sup>st</sup> place (John Deere tractor) Colby FFA and Baumgartner Lumber, 2<sup>nd</sup> place (Noah's Ark) BBD Sports Shop, 3<sup>rd</sup> place (dragon and knight) Nicolet Bank, and 4<sup>th</sup> place (crayon box) Colby Middle School Library.

Other participating builders included Abbotsford Health Care Center, AbbyBank, Colby Senior Care, Colby Nueva Jerusalem Hispanic Seventh-Day Adventist Church, GloryCroft Fibers, Royal Credit Union, Friends of the CCL, Colonial Center, Cherokee Chums 4-H, Loos Machine and Automation, Zion Lutheran Church, and Colby Community Library.
